

# Crayfish found in Oregon

## Native to Pacific Northwest

### Signal Crayfish

*Pacifastacus leniusculus*

Identified by:

1. Claws are smooth; lack bumps
2. White "signal" spot on claw pivot
3. Wide body plate on the back

## Invasive from Ohio and Kentucky

### Rusty Crayfish

*Orconectes rusticus*

Identified by:

1. Large reddish-brown (rusty) spots on sides of body plates
2. Claws have bumps

## Invasive from Louisiana

### Red Swamp Crayfish

*Procambarus clarkii*

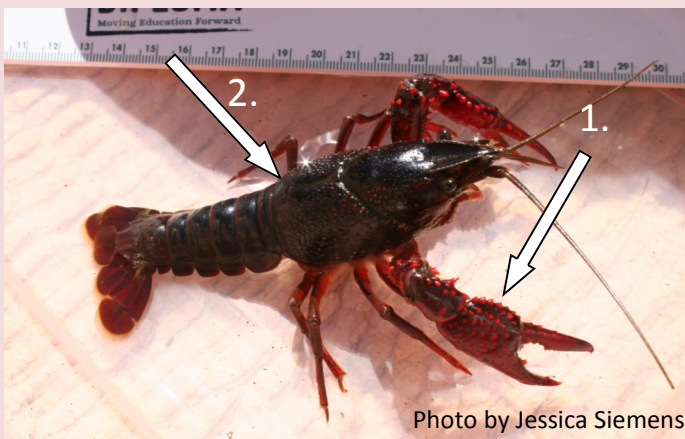

Identified by:

1. Large bumps located on body plates and claws
2. Lacks the body plate located on the back completely

## Invasive from the Great Plains

### Ringed Crayfish

*Orconectes neglectus*

Identified by:

1. Claws have orange tips and black bands
2. Thin body plate on the back
3. Dark markings on lateral sides of tale
