Native to Pacific Northwest Signal Crayfish

Pacifastacus Ieniusculus



Identified by:

- 1. Claws are smooth; lack bumps
- 2. White "signal" spot on claw pivot
- 3. Wide body plate on the back

Invasive from Ohio and Kentucky Rusty Crayfish

Orconectes rusticus




Identified by:

- Large reddish-brown (rusty) spots on sides of body plates
- 2. Claws have bumps

Invasive from Louisiana

Red Swamp Crayfish

Procambarus clarkii



Identified by:

- Large bumps located on body plates and claws
- Lacks the body plate located on the back completely

Invasive from the Great PlainsRinged Crayfish

Orconectes neglectus



Identified by:

- Claws have orange tips and black bands
- 2. Thin body plate on the back
- 3. Dark markings on lateral sides of tale
